

Mount Pearl Sports Hall of Fame Inductee Cindy Sooley Builder 2008



Cindy Sooley began her involvement with Gymnastics as a Board member in 1996 when she first joined the Board of the CBS Gymnastics Club. She sat on the Board from 1996 until 2000, serving as President from 1998 -2000.

In 2000, CBS was in the process of losing their part-time training facility at Topsail Elementary due to the schools reconstruction. In order to prevent the loss of the spirit that surrounds the gymnastics community in CBS and the future of gymnastics itself, Cindy collaborated with Wayne Andrews (President of Campia Gymnastics at the time) to solve the crisis both small gymnast clubs were going through. The merger of both clubs as one led to the substantial growth of Campia and its move to the current full-time facility in Donovan's Industrial Park.

Since this major contribution, Cindy has sat as a Board Member for Campia Gymnastics and remained on the

Board in 2008 as the Past–President, even though she no longer has children competing in gymnastics. She continues to devote her time and energy in updating and maintaining Campia's administrative records.

During her 12-year tenure on numerous gymnastics boards, Cindy oversaw the organization and execution of every competition that CBS or Campia held. Moreover, she has been a Team Manager for several events, the Board Secretary of Gymnastics in Newfoundland & Labrador multiple times, The Director of Policy and Procedures, the Co-Chair of Atlantic Gymnastics Championships and was the Team Manager of the Newfoundland Team that attended the Eastern Canadian Gymnastics Championships held in Montreal, Quebec in 2004.

Cindy is currently serving as a wealth of knowledge and information for the Board members of Campia. Her ceaseless display of devotion to the gymnastics community has significantly benefitted all of those who participate, and love the sport.
