


## Mount Pearl Sports Hall of Fame Inductee Ed Evelly Builder 2014



Ed Evelly has made a significant contribution to the sport of swimming in Mount Pearl (Marlins), in Canada, and indeed throughout North America. Starting off as a volunteer official in 1981, he eventually chaired many committees of the club and served as President from 1989 until 1992. During his tenure, the club hired its first full time coach. While President of the Marlins Ed served as Vice President of Swimming Newfoundland and from 1990 through 1996 as Provincial President. During his term as President, he was able to accomplish the following: acquire funding Government to hire a full time Executive Director; increase funding for swimmers' travel to tournaments; organize the Eastern Canada Cup and Junior Nationals Pilot; and start the St. John's Masters Swim Club, becoming a swimmer himself. In 1991 Ed began serving on the national Board of Directors of Swimming Canada. He filled the roles of Chair of the Finance Committee, Chair of the Athletes Reserve Fund,

Chair of the Membership Committee, liaison to Masters Swimming Canada, and Vice-President of Corporate and Community Services. He was also involved with the development and implementation of a Gender Equity Plan, Harassment and Abuse Policy, and a Governance Review of Swimming Canada from 2000 - 2002. Internationally, Ed has served or continues to serve with Union American de Natacion which oversees aquatics in the Americas, and with the Masters Committee of Federation Internationale de Natation as Chairperson. He has also been a speaker at their conventions. He is also currently Vice President of Masters Swimming Canada. Not being satisfied with being involved in administration only, Ed in more recent years has participated in several World Triathlons and other running, swimming and cycling events.
