

Mount Pearl Sports Hall of Fame Inductee Patrick (Pat Jr.) O' Keefe Athlete 2011



Pat O'Keefe is being recognized by the Mount Pearl Hall of Fame as an athlete for his numerous accomplishments in hockey, soccer, and ball hockey. He has also been involved in coaching hockey at the local and provincial levels, and served as President of the Intermediate Recreation League for many years. A leading points scorer in various leagues, Pat was awarded many Most Valuable Player Awards as well as awards for Most Gentlemanly and as an Effective Player.

From 1976 through 1982 Pat played Minor and High School hockey in Mount Pearl with considerable success. From 1984 until 1987 Pat played with the Junior Blades winning League, Provincial and Atlantic Championships – he was chosen as both league and playoff MVP. He also played on the Newfoundland and Labrador Winter Games Hockey Team that finished in 5th place at the

national Games, the highest a Newfoundland and Labrador team has ever finished. Pat also played Senior Hockey and continues to play in the Recreation League.

Pat's soccer career consisted of playing on several All Star teams as well as Provincial Championship teams from 1983 through 1985. Moreover, Pat won scoring championships and MVP awards in Ball Hockey and played on provincial championship teams for Ball Hockey as well.
