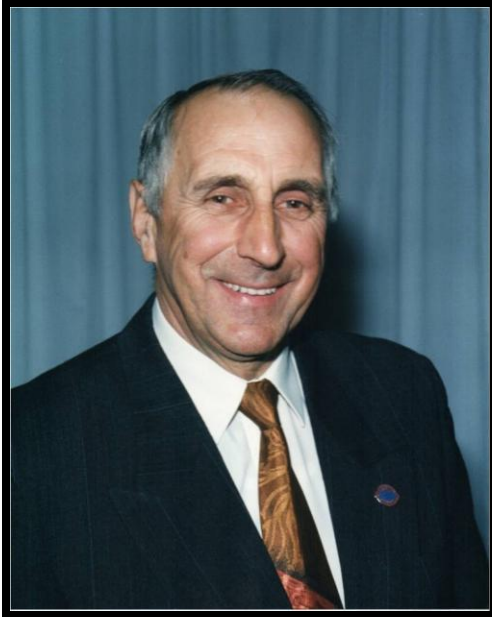

**Mount Pearl Sports Hall of Fame Inductee**  
**Reginald White**  
*Builder 1997*



For a number of years, Reginald (Reg) White has played a principal role in the Mount Pearl community with regard to the development of amateur sports. One of Reg's largest contributions has been to minor hockey. With minor hockey, he has assumed several volunteer roles, some of which being the organization of the Annual Appreciation Night and maintaining equipment for the Mount Pearl Minor Hockey League. Reg has also been instrumental in developing the policy and guidelines that dictate team travel regulations and coaching regulations. He has been recognized by the Newfoundland Amateur Hockey Association three times: in 1979 for his contribution to minor hockey, in 1986 for the development of minor officials and in 1992 he won the NAHA Meritorious Award for his outstanding service to minor hockey in Newfoundland and Labrador. Moreover, in 1984 he

was chosen as "Dad of the Year" by the Mount Pearl Hockey Dads Association.

In addition to his work in minor hockey, Reg has been instrumental in the development of officials for amateur sports. He is a founding member of the Avalon Hockey Referees Association and is a member of the Mount Pearl Softball Umpires Association and the Mount Pearl Baseball Umpires Association. Reg has served on the executive of many hockey, softball and baseball committees. When the Canada Summer Games were held in Mount Pearl in 1988, Reg acted as the Summer Games Officials Coordinator for all sporting events. Reg also conducts informative presentations for young referees on a regular basis.

During the Celebrations Days of 1988, Reg was presented with a Certificate of Merit by the Government of Canada in recognition of his contributions to his town. For his unstinting support of amateur sport and service to youth and the community as a whole, Reg was named Mount Pearl Citizen of the Year in 1990.

The Mount Pearl Sports Alliance recognizes Reg White's outstanding contributions with his induction to the Mount Pearl Sports Hall of Fame.
